2015 Moraleda Chardonnay, Vintae

£7.25 £30

Navarra, Spain

From the outskirts of Pamplona comes this elegantly oaked Chardonnay that oozes charm, soft hints of vanilla and nuts yet it still retains racy fruit.

2015 Grillo, Mandrarossa

Sicily, Italy

A creakingly vivid and intensely fresh wine with just a hint of grapefruit and lime, all from the sun drench coast of Menfi.

2015 Picpoul de Pinet, Réserve Roquemolière

Languedoc, France

A classically punchy Picpoul from the south of France showing off white peach and apricots with dash of freshness.

2015 Vermentino di Sardegna, Villa Solais, Santadi

Sardinia, Italy

Sardinia's most famous grape, this has a fuller, more herbal palate showing light almond flavours but still with a lick of acidity to finish.

2015 Grüner Veltliner, Höpler

Burgenland, Austria

A lighter style of white showing hints of pear drop sweetness and fresh zippy lime. Perfect with seafood.

2015 Pinot Blanc, Trimbach

Alsace, France

It transcends its modest price tag with finesse, breadth, mineral backbone and truly elegant poise and balance from the masters of Alsace.

2015 Albariño, Bodegas Fillaboa

£52

Rias Baixas, Spain

Fragrant and fruity, this wine is alive with enticing flavours of freshly cut green apple, juicy pineapple and hints of citrus.



2015 Gavi di Gavi DOCG, Fontanafredda

£54

Piemonte, Italy

Fontanafredda are synonymous with amazing quality wines and this Gavi di Gavi is no different. Elegant, bright, complex, it will not disappoint.

2015 Sancerre, Domaine Franck Millet

£58

Loire Valley, France

The wine has an intensely aromatic nose of leaves, herbs and minerals. It has fresh acidity and is dry and fruity with a flinty quality.

2013 Meursault, Domaine Jean-Michel Gaunoux

£85

Burgundy, France

Generous toasted almond nose with overtones of honey. Full bodied and very complex in the mid palate with a silky, glycerol texture intertwined with ripe fruit and buttery oak and a clean, mineral finish.

2015 Condrieu La Petite Côte, Domaine Cuilleron

£95

Rhône Valley, France

One of our favourites. Fantastic Viognier from an amazing estate nestled in the slopes of the northern Rhone. Rich and full with great acidity.

2010 Riesling Cuvée Frédéric Emile, Trimbach

£99

Alsace, France

100% Riesling that has seen 4 years of bottle aging before release, this is a wine that just keeps on giving. Rich, ripe acidity just keeps you aching for more.

2013 Puligny Montrachet 1er Cru Les Perrières, Jean Louis Chavy £110 Burgundy, France

It has a lifted mineral nose with subtle scents of honeysuckle and almond, certainly endowed with the vigour one expects from this vineyard. The palate is fine, harmonious and svelte on the entry. This is a Perrieres demonstrating typical fine mineral nuance and at its best

2007 Bienvenue Batard Montrachet, Grand Cru, Henri Boillot

Burgundy, France

Stone fruits and spicy oak on the nose, plus a suggestion of exotic fruits. Suave, rich and smooth, with powerful flavours of candied fruits, citrus peel and spicy oak.

2016 Petit Chenin, Ken Forrester Wines £8 £30

Western Cape, South Africa

A youthful fresh wine with quince and pear drop flavours. Real freshness on the palate with crunchy green apple and grapefruit flavours.

2015 Milestone Series Sauvignon Blanc, Crossroads £33

Hawkes Bay, New Zealand

A crisp style of Sauvignon Blanc from New Zealand's Hawke's Bay, with lemon, lime, grapefruit and passionfruit notes complemented by smoky nuances characters.

2015 Sauvignon Blanc, Sutherland £9.5 £38

Western Cape, South Africa

From the house of Thelema comes their more coastal vineyards. Fresh, zippy and elegant. His is the perfect half way Sauvignon between the Loire and Marlborough.

2016 The Dry Dam Riesling, d'Arenberg

£40

McLaren Vale, Australia

The great thing about d'Arenberg is that they are more than just wines. They are a true sense of place. Jasmine and orange blossom, along with lemon and lime characters leap from the glass.

2015 Pinot Gris, Peregrine Wines

£55

Central Otago, New Zealand

This wine is overflowing with ripe pear, peach, mango and grapefruit notes on nose and palate. Full-textured and mouth-filling, with a hint of fruit sweetness.

2013 Faultline Chardonnay, Kooyong

£75

Victoria, Australia

As about close to perfection as Chardonnay can be. Truly remarkable.

2010 Kistler Chardonnay, Hyde Vineyard

Carneros, California, USA

Apricots, orange blossoms and honeysuckle are some of the many nuances that emerge in a Chardonnay that impresses for its oily, expansive feel.

2016 Melodias Pinot Grigio, Trapiche

£30

Mendoza, Argentina

Elegant notes of citrus fruits, flavours of peach, apricot and orange peel followed by a slight sprinkle of spice just goes to show that Pinot Grigio does not need to be boring.

2014 Viognier, Bogle Vineyards

£45

California, USA

With an appetizing display of luscious apricot and peaches, Jody Bogles Viognier could only be from California. Load, in your face, this is restrained elegance. It is full on power.

2014 Eroica Riesling, Chateau Ste Michelle

£64

Columbia Valley, Washington State, USA

A joint venture between the King of Riesling, Ernie Loosen and Chateau Ste Michelle in Washington State, this proves the sheer potential for Riesling in North America. Sweet lime and tangerine aromas with subtle mineral notes, and a mouth-watering acidity that is beautifully balanced by the generously fruity Washington grapes.

2016 Petit Rosé, Ken Forrester

Western Cape, South Africa

This very elegant bright salmon pink Rosé overwhelms the nose with aromas of freshly picked strawberries, rose petal and cherry flavours.

2015 Berta Rosé Chiaretto IGT, Bertani

Veneto, Italy

This Merlot/Molinara blend is a beautiful lychee-pink in colour and has a rich, exotic nose. Great length and balance on the palate means that this pairs well with most things.

2015 Más Amor Rosado, Massard

£38

Catalunya, Spain

An amazing little rose from one of the nicest people in the world of wine, Franck Massard, this is light yet complex and dry. Packed full of fruit it has a stunning minerality on the finish. Truly speaking of where it is from.

2015 Las Fincas Rosé, Chivite Family Estates

Navarra, Spain

Chivite Las Fincas rosé is a collaboration between J. Chivite Family Estates and Juan Mari Arzak, the Spanish chef whose restaurant has had three Michelin stars for over 25 years. This rosé, a blend of Garnacha and Tempranillo and aged on its leesto give a rich, textured rose.

2015 Sancerre Rosé La Croix, Sylvain Bailly

Loire Valley, France

100% Pinot Noir, this wine is elegant and sophisticated.

2014 Barbera Amonte, Volpi

£30

Piemonte, Italy

This Barbera is mouth-watering food-friendly and layered in bright cherry fruit.

2015 Les Amandiers Merlot, Chateau du Vieux Parc

£7.25 £32

Languedoc, France

A blend of Grenache, Merlot and Syrah this is a rich and deep wine that shows a nice tannic structure. Firm and meaty.

2015 Nero d'Avola, MandraRossa

£34

Sicily, Italy

We love our indigenous Italian varietals here and this Nero d'Avola is no different. Bright, lively and with a soft lick of vanilla. It will keep you coming back for more.

2014 La Segreta Rosso, Planeta

£35

Sicily, Italy

A bit of a mega blend, this is Nero d'Avola, Merlot, Syrah and Cabernet Franc. It is concentrated, spicy, soft and elegant with hints of chocolate on the finish.

2013 Côtes du Rhône Villages Chusclan Rouge, Laudun Chusclan £37

Rhône Valley, France

Fresh red and dark cherries dominate this rising star of the Rhone. Fairly full bodied very forgiving.

2015 Brusco dei Barbi, Fattoria dei Barbi

Tuscany, Italy

The original Super Tuscan wine this 100% Sangiovesie is bursting with mulberries and dried fruit with hints of espresso and cream, however it retains a softness that is beguiling.

2015 Valpolicella DOC Bertani

Veneto, Italy

Intense notes of black currant red, plum, raspberry, black cherry and spice. In the mouth opens, fresh with a good balance between acidity, sweetness and sapidity.



2014 Crasto Douro Superior, Quinta do Crasto

Douro Valley, Portugal

It does not get much better than this. The Iconic Crasto has produced a wine so full of flavour and power and richness, it seems too good to be true. Trust us, it's not.

2014 Chianti Classico Storie di Famiglia, Cecchi

Classic Chainti from a Classic house. Cherries and spice and all things nice.

2015 Souson, Ailala Ribeiros Do Avia

£50

Ribeiro, Spain

Souson is known for its bracing acidity which is smoothed off here with judicious use of oak – around 4 months in barrel. It's vividly fruity – with plum skin, blueberry, cherry and raspberry. Incredibly fresh and a great red for the summer.

2013 Humilitat Priorat, Massard

£52

Priorat, Spain

Our friend Franck Massard again doing what he does best. Top quality Priorat. 50/50 Garnacha and Carinena, it is textured and seemless with a lick of granitic minerality and ripe fruit.

2011 Barolo di Serralunga d'Alba DOCG, Fontanafredda

£70

Piemonte, Italy

Blood red with ruby highlights, it has a clear-cut, intense nose with overtones of vanilla, spices, withered roses and underbrush. The palate is dry, but soft, full bodied, velvety and well balanced, and is engagingly complex throughout thelengthy finish.

2013 Gevrey-Chambertin La Justice Domaine Charlopin

Burgundy, France

Quality Pinot Noir from a top domaine in Burgundy. Slightly rustic, meaty and elegant.

2013 Château Talbot, 4ème Cru Classé

£165

Bordeaux, France

A marvellous array of flavours and aromas, especially blackcurrants, wild berries, leather, herbs, chocolate, vanilla, smoky oak and spices. The tannic structure is tight, well integrated and superbly crafted, beginning to soften now and revealing a seductive side to this famous wine.



2003 Château La Fleur Pétrus, Pomerol

£400

Pomerol, Bordeaux, France

A heavy-weight of the right bank. Merlot dominant and drinking wonderfully well now.

2005 Sassicaia, Tenuta San Guido

£475

Tuscany, Italy

The 2005 Sassicaia is another strong effort from Tenuta San Guido. Medium in body, it reveals an understated, delicate expression of smoke, herbs, tobacco and sweet dark fruit. The wine possesses compelling harmony and a gorgeous sense of inner perfume that flows from start to finish. This is an outstanding showing in a very challenging vintage.

2012 Richebourg Grand Cru, A-F Gros

£600

Burgundy, France

This is an unforgettable wine possessing depth and an amazing mix of contrasts: power and finesse. Hints of wild violets, black currant, vanilla and spices that meld into a velvety palate constitute the hallmark of the appellation (power and finesse). Give in to temptation right now.

2007 Chateau Ausone

£745

St Emilion, Bordeaux, France

The 2007 Ausone is a candidate for one of the wines of the vintage, rivaling Pavie and Lafite Rothschild. Its deep ruby/purple hue is accompanied by a beautiful nose of spring flowers, raspberries, black currants, and crushed rocks. The wine is dense, medium to full-bodied, and pure with sweet tannin as well as a surprisingly evolved, forward style.

2005 Chateau Margaux

£1450

Margaux, Bordeaux, France

One of the best wines of the outstanding 2005 vintage in Bordeaux. The Cabernet was upped to 85% and shows rich plum and purple colours in the glass, just softening around the edges. Attractive, just-starting-to-age claret aromas on the nose – liquorice, black truffles and soft black fruits, all carried through on to the palate, has all of the looked-for elements in play. Great plush texture, lovely balance of acidity, tannins and fruit, love the complexity and it really lingers on the palate.

2013 Journeymaker Shiraz Cinsault

Coastal Region, South Africa

This exciting blend of Shiraz and Cinsaut displays an array of ripe red berries. It follows through with a juicy, well structured palate and a smooth finish.

2013 The Footbolt Shiraz, d'Arenberg

£11 £41

McLaren Vale, Australia

Another triumph of the Osborne family. Their passion is Rhone varietals and this blend of majority Shiraz with a lick of Viognier and Cabernet produces an outstanding wine. Pepper spice, depth, complexity. One for the arm chair very late at night.

2013 Milestone Series Syrah, Crossroads

£46

Hawke's Bay, New Zealand

Sourced from the famous Hawke's Bay sub-region of Gimblett Gravels, this complex floral wine, with pepper, cherry, plum, blueberry and smoky aromas has a supple, silky palate with bass notes of sweet fruit, fine tannins, and a long spicy finish.

2014 Henry's Seven SGV, Henschke

£66

South Australia

A blend of Shiraz, Grenache, Mouvedre and Viognier from the 1st family of Australian wine making. Stephen and Prue Henscke out do themselves year after year. This is a rich textured and full-bodied wine that lifts you up.

2010 Penfolds Grange

South Australia

Need we say more. The 1st growth of South Australia and from one of the outstanding vintages so far this century according to winemaker Peter Gago.

2014 Pinot Noir Reserva, De Gras £7.75 £30

Leyda Valley, Chile

Seductively silky and smooth, this Pinot Noir ticks all of the right boxes.

2014 Estacion 1833 Cabernet Franc, Trapiche £9.5 £35

Mendoza, Argentina

This Cabernet Franc has aromas of dark fruits such as blueberries and blackcurrants with hints of white pepper. It is smooth on the palate with soft tannins.

2013 Estate Malbec, El Esteco £40

Salta, Argentina

A concentrated Malbec with notes of blueberries, dried fruits, raisins, coffee and a touch of herbaceousness. The vibrant palate has firm, juicy tannins and a long length.

2014 Columbia Valley Merlot, Chateau Ste Michelle £43

Columbia Valley, Washington State, USA

Elegant Merlot should not come from Eastern Washington State. It is hot, dry and a desert, yet Ch Ste Michelle excel themselves with this silky, smooth, rich and fruit wine.

2012 Cabernet Sauvignon, Long Meadow Ranch £79

Napa Valley, California

100% organic, the family not only grow wine but they have a huge organic farm in the centre of Napa Valley. Their whole ethos is centred around respect for the place which has help to create a truly beautiful complex Cabernet that will age for years.

2005 Pax, Agharta Syrah £275

Sonoma, California, USA

Opaque ruby. Black and blue fruit aromas are complemented by exotic notes of anise, incense and black cardamom. Fleshy but nicely focused black and blue fruit flavors gain sweetness with air and pick up notes of succulent herbs and candied flowers.
